

1. Lesson Topic “Missing and Incomplete Assignments in Google Classroom”
2. Description of your Learner - The learners are two groups, the first is the student and the second is the family of the student helping with homework.
3. Lesson Context (Learning/Performance Contexts) - The expectation is this project is to be done at school for the students and at home for the family. The simulator will provide reteaching opportunities for the learners through the process. The student will learn the process of finding missing assignments through the classwork tab from a specific course. The family will learn the process for finding missing assignments through the to-do menu from the home page.

4. Learning Objective

1. Students will be able to find missing and incomplete assignments using two different methods within their Google Classroom.
2. Students and families will be able to filter missing assignments by class and time.

2a	Have an inset image of the Google Classroom home page	Students, you are going to log into your Google classroom and click on one of your classes.	When the student clicks on the class icon progress to scene 3a.
3a	Update the inset image to the landing page of a Google Classroom page.	From your Class’s homepage you are not going to be using the stream today. Click on “Classwork”	When the student clicks on the word Classwork then progress to scene 4a.

4a	Update the inset image to the classwork page for the class.	The classwork page is where you can see the assignments by topic that have been assigned to you. If the circle next to the name is gray then it has been turned in. Click on one of the other assignments with a colorful button label to complete it.	If the student clicks on one of the unfinished classes, progress to scene 5a. If the student clicks on one of the finished classes then go to 6a.
5a	Success screen	Good job, you have identified a missing or incomplete assignment. You can either close this window and find your assignments in your own Google Classroom or go back home to do the family path.	On clicking the “Home” button connect to scene 1
6a	Oops, let's try again screen	Oh, you identified an assignment you have already completed. Let's go back to the classwork page and try again.	Click the try again to connect back to scene 4a
2b	Have an inset image of the Google Classroom home page	Families and Students, we are going to be using the To-do button on the left side of the screen.	Click the To-do button then connect to Scene 3b
3b	Change inset image to the To-do screen	From this window you can see all the assignments for all of your classes. The number of assignments will appear next to the down arrows that expand the different sections. The color code of bright color icons means the assignment is not yet turned in. Gray icons mean the assignment has been turned in. We only want to see assignments for the yellow class. Click the Class pulldown menu to choose yellow.	On clicking the Classes box to connect to Scene 4b
4b	Change inset image to only show the yellow classes assignments	Now we can see only the yellow class's assignments but we want to look at the missing only. The way we can do this is by click on the “Missing” menu heading	On clicking the Missing heading connect to Scene 5b

5b	Change inset image to show only the yellow class's missing assignments.	These are the yellow class's missing assignments sorted in the categories, "This Week," "Last Week," "Earlier." The numbers next to the drop arrows show you number of missing assignments. Click on the missing assignment from Last week.	When clicking on the missing assignment name connect to Scene 6b
6b	Success screen	Good job, you have identified a missing or incomplete assignment. You can either close this window and find your assignments in your own Google Classroom or go back home to do the student path.	If they click on Student connect to Scene 2a

The major interactions are going to be handled through the tutorials created in the program iorad. With this program it takes screen captures and short animations to create the step by step view of the tutorial. Since the screen captures are done in a browser format there will be minimal differences between Mac, PC, and Chromebook views. Within the program it's internal correction procedure will turned on to assist in independent reteaching. After the verbal and caption instruction the learner will get the opportunity to complete the task. If they click in the wrong area of the screen image, a contrasting color box will appear over the area needing to be interacted with. If the learner again interacts in the wrong area of the screen the box will turn off, replay the narration for that scene, and then restore the box. If for a third time they click on the wrong area a short video clip will play showing the clicking of that area and advance to the next scene.

The action of making a choice is the first step, learners can either travel down the Student or Family paths. The paths are written so that after successfully finishing that path the learner can stop there or travel through the other path.
